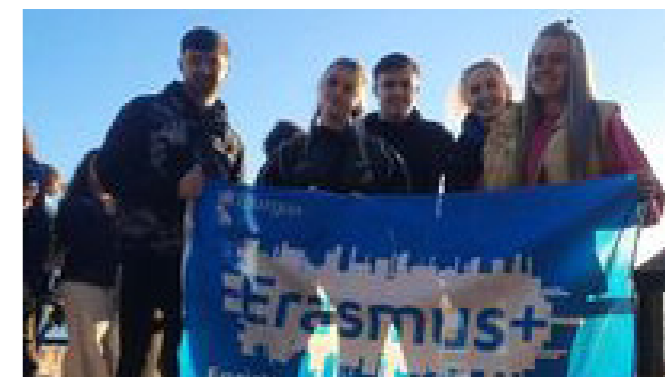

WORK EXPERIENCE OPPORTUNITY ABROAD WITH THE ERASMUS+ LEARNER MOBILITY

The College offers learners the opportunity to gain valuable work experience abroad, fully funded by the European Commission. This opportunity is open to all further education learners participating on a full-time Level 5 course and who will be over the age of 18 at the date of travel. Twenty learners will be selected and will complete 10 days work experience in their vocational area.



AWARDS AND PROGRESSION PATHWAYS TO HIGHER EDUCATION

All our courses lead to a QQI award, which is an internationally recognised qualification. Successful completion of a Major QQI Award at Level 5 or Level 6 allows you to apply through the CAO system for entry into participating courses in the Higher Education Links Scheme (HELs). HELs reserves places on specified courses for holders of full QQI certificates.



FEES

There are no tuition or registration fees for courses in 2024/2025, as part of DDELTB's response to the cost-of-living crisis. However a non-refundable acceptance fee is required to be paid in order to confirm the applicant is accepting a place on a course. Full details of fees per course are available from the College.

GRANTS

Learners on full-time Post Leaving Certificate courses may apply for the SUSI grant. Learners are recommended to apply as early as possible on www.susi.ie.

APPLYING

The College holds an Open Day each year, generally early in the New Year. Application for all courses is online on the www.greenhillscollege.ie website. Applicants are requested to pay a non-refundable acceptance fee to secure their place on a course, once they have been offered it. Where courses are full, learners may be placed on a waiting list and allocated places as they become available.

EDUCATIONAL SUPPORTS

The College applies for funding from SOLAS

for learners who need extra supports and resources. This applies to learners in Post Leaving Certificate courses. Learners who need such supports should fill in the relevant form which is available from the College and return it to the College as soon as possible after they have accepted the offer of a place. Learners will be requested to submit copies of Educational and other assessments.

VT.O.S.

Certain applicants may be eligible to avail of VTOS. VTOS learners have no fees to pay and obtain books and stationery free of charge. A weekly food and travel allowance is payable to VTOS learners.

To qualify for VTOS, applicants must be: 1. over 21 years of age and 2. in receipt of a qualifying payment from Intreo for at least six months (156 days) before the course start date. Further details about VTOS and the qualifying conditions are available from the College.
